Building on the rock

It was in 1841 that Captain Charles Elliot of the British Royal Navy declared Hong Kong island a 'barren rock'. Rock it most certainly is but today, hardly barren! Quickly it became a flourishing port and centre for trade. It was a stepping off point for missionary activity in China and Japan.

If we were back in 1841, a short walk from our MIC site down Queen's Road East towards the traffic lights, would bring us to the shore. If we were to walk further down, along QRE to the Hopewell Centre, we would be paddling in the sea! It was at this edge of Wan Chai, beside the garrison barracks, that the Wesleyan Methodists were granted the plot of land on which now we build.

Hong Kong has all the qualities of a rugged mountain that emerges out of the sea. It is therefore not a surprise that we find ourselves building on the solid rock. After digging the soft earth away, the construction firm excavating the site hit granite, a very hard rock, which will provide solid foundations for the new building.

Jesus told a parable about the man who built on rock.

'Everyone who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock' Matthew 7:24

We build on rock in two ways, on physical rock and spiritual rock. Millions of years ago, in the white heat of a volcanic intrusion, the granite was formed. This created a hard rock resisting erosion from wind and weather. Such rock becomes a solid foundation for our building.

Alleluia! We do not need to drill down to create foundations. There is no doubt we are, from this December, constructing a building on solid rock.

We also build on the Lord Jesus Christ, the rock of our faith, who we celebrate this Christmas and New Year. He is the one who can bring stability and peace to our lives. As we build on the foundation of Jesus' teaching and follow the manner of his life, we shape lives which enable us to flourish and grow as people. As we celebrate Christmas and move into 2016 we need to reflect on whether, and how, we are building on Jesus Christ, the rock of our faith.

The psalmist often refers to God as 'our rock', solid, dependable. The early Christian preachers also used the idea of Jesus as a rock. In the book of Acts, Peter refers to Jesus as the 'cornerstone', a word which may be translated 'keystone', the stone at the top of an arch which keeps the whole structure in place. Millions of people today find Jesus to be the dependable, faithful, merciful Saviour, a rock on which to build for a lifetime.

The service, carefully drafted, with prayers and hymns, led by the choir, keyboard and brass instruments was deeply moving. There was many a tear in the eye of people who had worshipped for years at MIC, mine too! Of course the service was well led by President Sung Che Lam, Past Presidents and many of those involved in the design and development of the new building.





For the congregations of MIC this has been, since we left the building, a hard eighteen months and a time of loss. However standing in the depth of what will become the basement of the building with a youth room and one of the worship halls, was a moment of hope... a real conviction that this new building will

rise to the Glory of God and the ministry of the Methodist Church, Hong Kong. It will be a building inhabited by a people of power, seeking to worship and serve God in this community and across Hong Kong. There was a real sense of Alleluia! about the event which will accelerate our determination to

support the redevelopment generously and sacrificially. Praise God for the event and thanks to all who enabled it to happen.

Walkathon 2015




Alleluia! Rejoice! We have raised \$105million for the redevelopment!
