With annual revenue of over US\$32 billion, Nike is the biggest sports apparel manufacturer in the world. We see it everywhere - clothing, sports grounds, publicity billboards and of course worn by celebrities. But did you know that Nike was the ancient Greek goddess who personified victory? The ancient story of Nike claims that Nike flew around battlefields rewarding the Victors with glory and fame, symbolized by a wreath of laurel leaves. In the ancient world winning - coming first - whether in battle or in sporting events like the Olympiad was everything. There were no silver or bronze medals for second or third places, only the wreath of laurels for the victor whose victory drew divine favour from the gods.

St Paul was well aware of the ancient world's obsession with competition and winning, of courting the divine favour of the gods. Along with other biblical writers St Paul likened the Christian faith to running a race. Competitors needed to prepare well, to have courage and stamina and endurance not only to compete but to win: Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. (1 Cor 9: 24). And of course for Paul, the prize was not a mere perishable laurel wreath handed out by Nike, but the crown of eternal life bestowed by the King of Kings which is imperishable.

### **Sharing by** "Prayer Warrior"

The revival Prayer Movement of the church "Let us bless this House" began on January 3 last year. It is a series of 24 prayer meetings organized by our Church to pray for the

redevelopment and funding of the project of MICHK and Conference Building. In the afternoon of the monthly Holy Communion, brothers and sisters of the whole Church gather together to pray and commit this important project to God.

It has been a year and a half since the commencement of the redevelopment project prayer meetings, and I am grateful that I was able to attend every one of them. What has motivated my continued participation is the power and support derived from prayers. The budgeted cost for the redevelopment project is \$450 million, which I thought an unreachable goal and questioned how our Church could possibly raise that kind of money. But now, we are only \$110 million away from the target as \$300 million has been raised in less than 2 years. Isn't that God's grace and that He has listened to our prayers?

A hymn I used to sing during Sunday school is often in my mind: "more prayers more power, less prayers less power, no prayer no power. We should pray consistently." Our church founder John Wesley got up every morning at four o'clock and prayed at a small table in the room. His prayer for the church throughout his life was known as the "power plant" for the revival of the church and the Methodist movement at that time. Our President, Revd Lam Sung-che said that he hoped the prayer meetings held every month for the redevelopment project would become a movement for the revival of the church. I also made a commitment to my heavenly Father that I would

participate in all 24 redevelopment project prayer meetings with brothers and sisters from different local churches to ask our Lord keep and guide the redevelopment of the new building.

There were obstacles that could have prevented me from attending the past 17 meetings. Last summer, I was to be absent from Hong Kong, thus could not be attend the July and August prayer meetings. I had to make changes to my itinerary and flights to enable my attendance. Thanks be to the Lord and I managed to depart after the July prayer meeting and come back before the August meeting. I faced another challenge in May this year. I had to chair the parish committee meeting as the chairperson on 7th May afternoon when the prayer meeting was to take place at the same time. I resolved this by starting the parish meeting earlier and left the second part of the meeting to the vice chairman. When I arrived the prayer meeting Rev Maria Lau had just started her sermon. As soon as the prayer meeting finished at 4:30pm, I dashed back to the Epworth Village Methodist Church for the parish committee meeting.

Among the 17 prayer meetings, the most unforgettable one was the one in April this year. After the meeting in SKH Tang Shiu Kin Secondary School, Revd Lam invited the

participants to walk to the construction site which is located at the junction of Queen's Road East and Kennedy Road and prayed in front of the church building which had reached 20 storeys. When the party arrived, everyone started to praise the Lord, amazed at the new MICHK and Conference Building that stood right before us.

The reconstruction and fund raising project is not yet complete. Let's work hard together and support the project with our prayers and actions.


